The Hispanic Education Endowment Fund

The Orange County Hispanic Education Endowment Fund (HEEF) of the Orange County Community Foundation (OCCF) provides scholarships for Orange County (OC) graduating high school seniors and community college transfer students, and a limited number of renewal awards to previous scholarship recipients. Eligible applicants will be considered for a General HEEF scholarship and for two additional specialized scholarships: see pages 5-6.

Eligibility

1) be of Hispanic descent; 2) live in Orange County; 3) graduate from an OC high school or transfer from an OC community college; 4) have financial need; 5) demonstrate academic achievement and school/community/volunteer involvement, or a work history.

Application Requirements

Applicants must:

- ✂ **Complete *and sign* the 4-page application**
- ✂ **Write an essay as specified in the application**
- ✂ **Attach a copy of a high school or college transcript**
- ✂ **Attach a copy of the first two pages of a 2007 or 2008 U.S. Income Tax Return**
- ✂ **OR complete the Financial Information requested on page 3.**
- ✂ **Postmark all materials on or before **Friday December 19, 2008**. Mail to:**

Timeline

HEEF and OCCF Foundation staff will review applications. Note the following dates:

- Friday, December 19, 2008:** Application and supporting documents must be postmarked by this date. Regular mail is encouraged. Certified or registered mail is not required.
- March 20, 2009:** Notification of application status.
- April 18, 2009:** Interviews will be held at Santa Ana College for selected students.
- June TBA:** Scholarship recipients must attend The Scholars Awards Reception.

HEEF General Scholarships -- Four Categories for Fall 2009

Scholarship of Excellence: For superior academic achievement (3.8 GPA or higher) in high school or community college.

Award Amount: \$2,500 Max. Projected # of Awards: 10

High School Seniors: To attend a college, university, community college or trade school.

Award Amount: \$1,000 Max. Projected # of Awards: 50

Community College Students: For community college transfer students to a 4-year college or university.

Award Amount: \$1,000 Max. Projected # of Awards: 10

Renewable Scholarship for Community College or University and College Students:

For academic achievement (3.5 GPA or higher) , financial need and involvement in college/community activities.

Award Amount: \$1,000 Max. Projected #: 10

Applicants must meet specific criteria required for these specialized scholarships.

Architecture and Engineering Scholarship Program

For high school seniors with a minimum 3.5 GPA, who have been accepted into an accredited 4 or 5-year program in Architecture or Engineering; or for Community College transfer students with a minimum 3.2 GPA who have been accepted into an accredited program in Architecture or Engineering. Scholarship may be renewable based on academic performance.

Arts Scholarship Program: High school seniors interested in music, drama, dance, visual or fine art and graphic design.

Award Amount: \$1,000 Max. Projected # of Awards: 1 – 2

Association of Hispanic Professionals for Education

High school seniors (3.0 GPA) majoring in Business Administration with involvement in school or community activities.

Applicants must meet specific criteria before applying for the following scholarships.

Chapman University Scholarship Program

For high school Latino/a students of immigrant parents. Applicants must be admitted and enroll at Chapman through the regular admissions process, have significant financial need as defined by the Federal needs analysis formula; have attained a cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale; and demonstrate involvement in extracurricular or other activities.

De La Libertad Scholarship Fund: For clients of Human Options and/or their children.

Support for victims of domestic violence in their quest to achieve personal freedom, physical safety, and economic independence through education. Scholarships are for educational attainment at a 2- or 4-year college or University, certified vocational training program, or other educational curricula approved by Human Options.

Hispanic Bar Association/Wally Davis Memorial Legal Scholarship Fund

In memory of Wally Davis, one of the first Hispanic attorneys in Orange County, whose legal career was dedicated to Civil Rights, The OC Hispanic Bar Association (HBA) awards scholarships to admitted and enrolled Law School students. MANA De Orange County: For Latinas whose families qualify for federal financial aid.

Soka University of America Scholarship Fund

Two scholarships are awarded annually to Latino/a high school seniors who have been accepted at Soka; demonstrate financial need based on the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA); have earned a cumulative GPA of 3.0 on a 4.0 scale; and have evidence of strong extracurricular activities demonstrating leadership potential.

Award Amount: \$1,500 Max. Projected # of Awards: 2 – 5

Vanguard University Scholarship Fund

For high school seniors who have been admitted at Vanguard University. Scholarship may be used for tuition, books and fees.

Award Amount: \$1,000 - \$2,500 Max. Projected # of Awards: 2-5
